

Stand The Gap Pilot Program

Bridging Crisis, Grief, and Community Support

Purpose

Stand The Gap is a trauma-informed homicide and grief response program designed to provide immediate support, resource navigation, advocacy, and stabilization services to individuals, families, and communities impacted by homicide and violent loss.

Target Population

Individuals impacted by homicide, surviving family members, witnesses to violence, community members experiencing traumatic grief, and youth and adults affected by violent crime.

Services Provided

- Crisis Response
- Grief Navigation
- Systems Navigation
- Case Management and Resource Linkage

Referral Sources

Hospitals, Emergency Departments, Law Enforcement Agencies, Schools, Community Organizations, Faith-Based Organizations, and Self-Referrals.

Pilot Timeline

Phase 1 (0–90 Days): Community outreach, partnership development, referral process implementation.

Phase 2 (90–180 Days): Service delivery, data collection, outcome monitoring.

Phase 3 (180–365 Days): Program evaluation, sustainability planning, and expansion opportunities.

Expected Outcomes

Increased access to support services, reduced barriers to resources, improved community engagement, enhanced emotional stabilization following traumatic loss, and increased connection to long-term support systems.
